# SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

This week, we celebrate the feast day of **St John of God** on Wednesday, 8<sup>th</sup> March. John, the founder of the Brothers Hospitallers, was born in Portugal. When he joined the army to fight for Spain against the French, he gave up his Christian beliefs. At the age of 40, he decided to give the rest of his life to God's service and headed for Africa where he hoped to free captive Christians. After much hardship, he established a house in Spain to care for the sick and poor. Twenty years after his death, his helpers formed the Brothers Hospitallers, now a worldwide religious order. Canon Gregory's friend, Fr Aldo Tapparo, a regular visitor here in St Patricks, first trained as a nurse with the order.

On Friday, 10<sup>th</sup> March, we remember **St Dominic Savio**, the patron saint of juvenile delinquents. At the age of 12, he joined St John Bosco as a student at the Oratory in Turin where he helped care for abandoned and neglected boys. Sadly, he died at the age of 17. He was canonized in 1956.
