THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

St George's Day is celebrated tomorrow, Monday. **St George**, the patron saint of England, was martyred in Palestine in 303. Legend says he promised people he would rid them of a dragon monster if they believed in Jesus Christ after which 15,000 people were baptised.

St Mark the Evangelist is remembered on Tuesday. He wrote the second Gospel which emphasises the miraculous powers of the Saviour.

On Thursday, we remember the only saint from the Canary Islands, **San Pedro de Betancour**, who was a shepherd boy in Tenerife. In 1650, he travelled to Guatemala where, after years of hard work, he opened a hospital, a homeless shelter and a school for the poor. His shrine in Tenerife, near El Medano, is the simple cave he lived in while he tended sheep. Pope John Paul II made a pilgrimage there to say Mass.

COMMUNION UNDER BOTH KINDS

Receiving both the Body and Blood of Christ, ie, 'communion under both kinds' has been an option in our own parishes for many years but, sadly, the COVID-19 pandemic gave rise to very legitimate concerns about distribution under both species and therefore dioceses and parishes worldwide stopped offering communion under both kinds. Now, thankfully, after an absence of over two years, the Bishops of England and Wales have decided that we will be able, once again, to start offering the opportunity to receive the precious Blood from the Chalice during Mass. Put simply, Jesus said "take and eat' take and drink...". It will, of course, be each individual's choice whether they receive from the chalice or not and, as we know, the Church teaches that the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ is present in both the Sacred Host and Precious Blood, so there is no *obligation* to receive Holy Communion from the chalice.

St Patrick's Church will reintroduce Communion under both kinds from Sunday 30th April.

REST IN PEACE
