FEAST OF SS PETER AND PAUL

On Monday, 1st July, Pope Francis will preside at a special meeting in Rome to give formal approval to the canonisation process of **Blessed Carlo Acutis**, the 15-year-old web designer who is set to become the first millennial saint. Keen to transmit the faith to a younger generation, he created a website to catalogue all Eucharistic miracles and a list of approved Marian apparitions. Carlo was born in London in 1991 and his family moved to Milan later that year. He died from leukaemia in 2006. Thursday, 3rd July is the feast of **St Thomas the Apostle.** Known as 'doubting Thomas' he has also been thanked by Church fathers for his scepticism which was the occasion for reassuring future generations.

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

There will be a second collection for Stella Maris (the Apostleship of the Sea), the official maritime welfare agency of the Catholic Church.

CHARITY BEGINS AT HOME

St Patrick's Parish is brilliant at raising funds for charity and for donating to charitable appeals. Unfortunately, the regular weekly offertory donations which are given through (a) Standing Order, (b) Dona Machine, (c) collection at Mass are insufficient to run the parish. Sadly, the Charity Shop which formerly was our biggest regular fundraising activity cannot attract volunteers, so it is mostly closed. The Charity Shop has not contributed any donations at all to the parish for almost a year. A loss of over £10,000 a year. The number of members in the "300 Club" has declined to 230 a reduction of 70 members or £70 a week, a loss of £3640 a year. The Grant Bradley Trust has been a big benefactor to the parish and the school, but its income is depleted and its ability to make donations is depleted. We thank the Trust for covering all the costs associated with Father Antonio Marcos and all our visiting priests. Father Jerome, Father Jan, Father Henry, Abbot David, etc. (Approximately £30,000 p.a.).

Like all households, the parish has suffered from rising prices, especially electricity and gas over the past two years.

The consequences of the loss of income and rising prices is that St Patrick's Parish in the past two years has an overdraft of £34,000 and rising. Income does not equal expenditure.

The diocese has asked the parish to.

a. Reduce the overdraft.

b. Balance the books

Everyone will need to help. Canon Gregory suggests the following.

1. Everyone is asked to increase their offertory giving by 20%.

- 2. From 1st July the second collection will be reintroduced at all Masses. Every working adult is asked to give £1 a week to the second collection. If you can, please try to donate £2 a week. The Bishop requests that about 15 second collections a year are held in church for various charities and on these Sundays the second collection will go to their causes. On the other Sundays (37) the second collection will go to the overdraft
- 3. Please covenant your donation. This increases your giving by 25% from the government refund.
- 4. The Parish Council will restart the Parish Fundraising Committee which will promote events for the benefit of St Patrick's.

The task of making the parish financially viable is the responsibility of all parishioners. A bit of effort from each **ONE** becomes a massive contribution from us

ALL. ONE and ALL is the way forward. Your help will be gratefully appreciated.

ROSARY FOR PEACE

Members of the Legion of Mary from Bristol Metropolis have embarked on praying the Rosary for peace on Saturday of every fortnight at the Grounds of Broadmead in Bristol City Centre at 2.00pm. It is open to every interested member of the church and the public. We have had non-Catholics joining in the prayer. St Patrick's Praesidium "Our Lady Untie of Knots is ably represented every time.

The grave challenges confronting the world at the start of this new Millennium lead us to think that only an intervention from on high, capable of guiding the hearts of those living in situations of conflict and those governing the destinies of nations, can give reason to hope for a brighter future.

"When once men recognize, both in private and public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessings of real liberty, wellordered discipline, peace and harmony." Pope Pius XI, The Encyclical on the Kingship of Christ.

The Rosary is also a prayer for peace because of the fruits of charity which it produces. Praying the rosary for peace will produce peace among people and nations. When prayed well in a truly meditative way, the Rosary leads to an encounter with Christ in his mysteries and so cannot fail to draw attention to the face of Christ in others, especially in the most afflicted. How could one possibly contemplate the mystery of the Child of Bethlehem, in the joyful mysteries, without experiencing the desire to welcome, defend and promote life, and to shoulder the burdens of suffering children all over the world?

Apostolic Letter "Rosarium Virginis Mariae" of the Supreme Pontiff John Paul Ii to the Bishops, Clergy and Faithful on The Most Holy Rosary Article 6 "Prayer for Peace and for the Family" states

"A number of historical circumstances also make a revival of the Rosary quite timely. First of all, the need to implore from God the gift of peace. The Rosary has many times been proposed by my predecessors and myself as a prayer for peace. At the start of a millennium which began with the terrifying attacks of 11 September 2001, a millennium which witnesses every day, in innumerable parts of the world, fresh scenes of bloodshed and violence; to rediscover the Rosary means to immerse oneself in contemplation of the mystery of Christ who "is our peace", since he made "the two of us one, and broke down the dividing wall of hostility" (Eph 2:14). Consequently, one cannot recite the Rosary without feeling caught up in a clear commitment to advancing peace, especially in the land of Jesus, still so sorely afflicted and so close to the heart of every Christian".

The World needs peace today more than ever. From Ukraine to Russia, Gaza and Israel, Lebanon and the entire Middle East. Let us come together to pray for peace in the world through Our Mother Mary, The Queen of Peace and Our Lord and Saviour The Prince of Peace.
