Following a recent Ofsted inspection of St Patricks School we congratulate Mr Michelle Marshal (Headteacher) and Mrs Jo Deasey (Chair Governors) and all the staff, pupils and parents on achieving the rating of "GOOD" in all five areas of inspection Education, Behaviour and Attitude, personal Development, Leadership and Management, Early year provision.

The following is an extract from the Ofsted executive summary.

#### What is it like to attend this school?

Pupils are proud to attend St Patrick's Catholic Primary School. They talk positively about how the school values enable them to feel part of a 'community' where everyone is kind, gentle and fair. Many parents comment favourably about the school's nurturing and inclusive ethos and the care that staff show to pupils and their families. Staff follow the school's 'behaviour charter' to model the high expectations for pupils' behaviour. This starts in the early years where children listen carefully and follow instructions well. Across the school, pupils are polite, friendly and well mannered. They behave well in lessons and move around the school calmly and sensibly. Staff and pupils enjoy positive and respectful relationships. Pupils feel safe and trust adults to listen to them when they need to share any worries or concerns.

# REFLECTIONS ON THE SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

The Brazilian Community held a Meeting with Couples in the Brooks Hall on September 13th, from 7pm to 11pm. Organised by the Family Ministry and led by Gracielli and Lucas from the Manchester Community, the meeting brought together 25 couples. The prayers and sharing were illuminated by chapter 3, verse 14 of Saint Paul's Letter to the Colossians: "And above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds them together in perfect harmony" (Col 3:14). This meeting marked the end of the program entitled 'Reflections on the Sacrament of Marriage', which began in January of this year, 2024. In the first phase of the project, Father Antonio and the couples Gabi and Tony,

Maíra and Derlon made visits, inviting them to participate. The meetings, led by the same team, were held monthly starting in March. On the days of the meetings, which took place from 7:30 pm to 10pm, the couples met in the Shore Gallery and the Community remained in Adoration in the Church. The meetings began before the Eucharistic and ended with the Blessing of the Blessed Sacrament. # FROM MRS MARSHALL- HEADTEACHER ST PATRICK'S SCHOOL – LIVEABLE NEIGHBOURHOOD

As you are aware there will be changes to local access due to the implementation of the LN scheme in the autumn. Despite ongoing representation from the school and parish, the Local Authority has not made any changes to the original plan. This will impact access to the school and church as there will be a bus gate between Netham Rd and Pile Marsh meaning that there will be no access to and from Avonvale Rd. Beaufort Rd will no

longer be a through road but will be sectioned off into areas by street planters. There will be access in and out of these sections on to Church Rd.

Prior to the holidays myself and Chris Boateng (representing the Parish) met with Local Authority representatives and Councillor Rob Bryher. I have raised a number of ongoing concerns including pupil safety, parking, inconvenience to those who must travel on to work. The Local Authority representatives are willing to meet with parents to discuss possible routes to and from the school.


